

But in the chaos of Vietnam, in 1970, a young visionary made a daring pledge to bring that inner suffering to light. Captain Shad Meshad, the youngest officer in the US military at the time, embarked on a groundbreaking oddessy: to give a voice to those haunted by what would later be known as PTSD. With unmatched courage, he plunged into the heart of battle - not just on the frontlines, but within the very souls of the soldiers, determined to expose and confront the pain lurking deep inside.

SYNOPSIS

CAPTAIN FOR DARK MORNINGS is Psych Officer Captain Shad Meshad, the youngest Captain to return from the Vietnam War, is haunted by the horrors he witnessed. He searches for purpose among the burned-out encampments at Venice Beach, where homeless veterans cling to survival. Each has deep wounds and their agony thrusts Shad back in time to remember that harrowing year and confront the devastating reality of PTSD as he searches for a new way to treat the troops.

Reeling from a suicide bombing that nearly claimed his life, Shad arrives at the 95th Evac Hospital in Da Nang Vietnam. Unprepared for the horrors, he is plunged into chaos on his first night. As heroic doctors and nurses triage the waves of broken and bloodied soldiers, Shad, in sweltering heat, must do the unthinkable - sort the living from the dead. With shaking hands, he places dog tags in the mouths of fallen boys and zips their shattered bodies into bags. Each gesture pulls him deeper into the nightmarish reality that will change him forever.

The relentless tide of trauma leaves Shad obsessed to help. He becomes a confidant to soldiers consumed by fear and guilt, including Bobby Timmons, a young farm boy on the brink of mental collapse. Shad fights to save him, but Colonel Bratmann, the hospital's commander, dismisses the boy's suffering and forces him back to the frontlines like so many other grunts. Pushed past his breaking point, Timmons kills Bratmann with a grenade, and maims himself in the process. Timmons begs Shad to help him die, but Shad can't play God. After Shad leaves, Timmons takes his own life, leaving Shad tormented by his inability to save the boy.

Embittered by the absurdity of command and the senseless horrors inflicted upon the soldiers, Shad returns home. When the men are greeted by protests and labeled 'murderers' and 'baby killers', Shad is outraged by the callous indifference and vows to fight for his fellow veterans. His experience at Venice Beach fueling his resolve, Shad vows to bring hope to those lost in the shadows and shatter the people's ignorance of the unseen wounds of war.

Based on the acclaimed true story and adapted from the popular book, Captain for Dark Mornings is a visceral, unflinching portrait of resilience, redemption, and the relentless pursuit to heal the invisible scars of combat.



ORIGINS and DISCOVERY OF PTSD HEALING

The contested and unpopular Vietnam War fueled extreme incidence of crime, racism, rape, desertion, and fragging (killing of commanding officers) exposed in CAPTAIN FOR DARK MORNINGS. From a boots-on-the-ground perspective, this film offers a raw and unflinching look at the trauma endured by soldiers, medical personnel, and civilians alike.

But this film digs deeper. Raw and unflinching, yet peppered with gallows humor, it tells its tale through the eyes of one dedicated man - Captain Shad Meshad - as he scours for solutions to the psychological problems he and others faced during his tour and beyond.

Not yet labeled PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder) - now "PTS," Shad pioneered methods to help treat what was then known as "shell shock" and advocated for ailing soldiers and personnel in the midst of inept command and unreasonable leadership demands. Shad's character, humor and positive attitude challenged the harsh realities of war head on. Even threat of an absurd Court-Martial for his mustache, Shad's personified his ability to navigate unreal circumstances with humor and respect. And his evolving understanding of PTSD helped him aid soldiers both on and off the battlefield.


With dignity, Shad fought then and fights to this day with passion and determination - because every man and every woman counts.





MAJOR CHARACTER DESCRIPTIONS - PART ONE

CAPTAIN FLOYD "SHAD" MESHAD

Shad enlists when he could have had a much safer job due to his education. Assigned to the 95th Evac Hospital as a Psychological Officer, Shad, at 24, is the youngest officer in Vietnam and develops his own methods to help Soldiers with what will later be called PTSD. Shad is exhausted by the never-ending line of Soldiers who talk with him about their unimaginable experiences. Wanting to help them all, he's overcome by his inability to help and ends up experiencing his own PTSD. But the experience will set Shad on his lifelong path to help those affected by the horrors of war.

CORPORAL BOBBY TIMMONS

A farm boy from Iowa, Timmons, 19, is an animal lover and mellow soul. The boy represents every man suffering from the unseen wounds of war. Unable to fathom the loss of his entire platoon, he tries to grit through it, but denied rest and help from Colonel Plummer, becomes a casualty that Shad does everything for, but can't save. It's the Bobbys' of the world that put Shad on a course that will ultimately help hundreds of thousands of Veterans from all wars.

COLONEL BANKS

A fair man and father figure for Shad, Banks believes in Shad's methods and gives him the latitude he needs to help soldiers with PTSD. Banks is Head of Medical Services for One and Two Corps. When Banks is discharged and sent home, Shad is left without a mentor and advocate and will be forced to fight with all he's got for his patients' rights.







MAJOR CHARACTER DESCRIPTIONS - PART TWO

COLONEL PLUMMER

In charge of a large military base, Plummer is an advocate of war and drives his men too far in an effort to achieve his personal goals. Hearing rampant complaints about the base, Banks sends Shad to interview people and learns the problem is Plummer. Here Shad meets Bobby Timmons after the decimation of Timmons' platoon. Shad pleads for Plummer to send Timmons home or at least allow him R and R. But Plummer sees it as Shad 'coddling' the boy. This pits Shad and Plummer against each other and starts a rivalry that will follow Shad through his tour.

MAJOR ELAINE SWANSON

A combat nurse who is calm in the face of chaos, Elaine helps Shad stay grounded. Shad falls for her immediately and she for him, but Elaine is married and the relationship can never be. Shad would give anything to be with her, but he's a gentleman and won't go there. Elaine helps Shad see that he's fighting the good fight.

JIM WILTON

A rebel from Missouri, Wilton is a JAG Officer at Camp Horn, who's in charge of hearing fragging cases and other serious crimes. He and Shad become fast friends when Shad visits him to file patient reports, including one for a fragging. Down the road, Wilton will defend Shad in a case that will eventually cost Shad his position at the 95th.

LIEUTENANT BOB FRANCO


A New York Italian with a heavy Brooklyn accent, Franco is the kind of leader everyone wants. Always looking out for his men, Franco would never ask them to do anything he wouldn't do himself. He too is a little bit in love with Elaine, but is indebted to her for the introduction to Shad and being the catalyst for their lifelong friendship.












INCENTIVES AND SHOOT LOCATIONS (Thailand/Los Angeles)

Attractive cost incentives in Thailand make it the ideal location for this film. Our set design focuses on creating detailed, partial sets authentic to China Beach aided by CGI set extensions - such as mountains, atmospheric elements, and helicopters—used to authentically recreate the 95th Evac Hospital. This approach prioritizes realism, allowing us to capture raw, visceral moments through minimal stage shooting and strong military support. Bangkok offers street architecture that still reflects the look of 1970s Saigon, while Los Angeles will host key scenes, including Helicopter crash, 1973 burnt-down POP Pier (with partial sets with LED Unreal Engine technology), Oakland processing and riots, courtroom and JAG office scenes.

THAILAND INCENTIVES

The initial estimate for 33 days of filming—including 30% partial set builds and all in-country location shoots—is \$5.7 million USD. Production services will be provided by an experienced Thailand-based production company with decades of expertise and full support pledged.



SHAD MESHAD, LCSW, CTS, TFTdx - 2023 - US Veteran's Hall of Fame

For almost five decades, National Veterans Foundation (NFV) Founder and President Shad Meshad has worked as a therapist for veterans and an advocate for veterans' rights. After receiving his master's degree in psychiatric social work from Florida State University, he enlisted in the army in 1970 and served as a counselor for U.S. soldiers in Vietnam.

Upon his return to the U.S., Meshad founded and directed the Vietnam Veterans Re-Socialization Unit at the VA Hospital in Los Angeles. It was the first program of its kind, focusing on the readjustment problems of Vietnam veterans. During this time, Meshad was among the first to study the disorder now known as Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).

In 1978, he worked to develop and lobby for the National Vietnam Veterans Readjustment Bill. In 1979, Meshad founded the Vet Center Outreach Program, which now serves veterans in more than 300 locations across the country.

In 1980, Meshad was nominated for the first Olin Teague Medal of Service Award. In 1982, he published a memoir of his experiences in Vietnam, entitled "CAPTAIN FOR DARK MORNINGS." In 1985, he founded the Vietnam Veterans Aid Foundation, which he later renamed the National Veterans Foundation.

He has served on the faculty of the International Critical Incident Foundation; as President and Board Member of the Association of Traumatic Stress Specialists; and, was recently appointed to the Board of Directors of the Green Cross Project.

Today, Meshad consults and teaches stress reduction and anger management techniques to mental health, law enforcement, and critical incident professionals through Quantum Performance institute, a firm he established in 2001. He continues his work with veterans in the Los Angeles area, helping them through the process of healing and readjustment and is a regular contributor to the Huffington Post raising awareness about issues returning veterans' face.

Enamored with TV, Nancy's co-written *Purgatory*, a period western pilot and 2021 Austin second-rounder; *Blue Hour*, a dark dramedy pilot and 2022 ISA Emerging Screenwriters



Quarterfinalist; Funeral Club, a dark dramedy pilot; and Lake Crescent, a female-driven, supernatural pilot. In 2021, she was rehired to co-write the Vietnam book as a limited series. Her latest endeavor is a co-written sci-fi thriller feature titled Exit The Machine.

Geralyn Smith - Pitch Feedback: Scott's pitch for "Captain for Dark Mornings" was a fascinating read! The document is visually captivating and its evident from these pages that a lot of careful development has already gone into the series. The story is emotionally resonant on multiple levels and is full of beautifully complex character dynamics. I am typically hesitant about the commercial viability of limited series as there has been a trend away from that format in the marketplace. However, I think that this series could be a strong contender as is. I am "passing" on the pitch but only because this project is outside of my current development purview. I have high hopes for this series and am eager to see it come to fruition.

Jeff Boone - Feedback: The first ten pages of CAPTAIN FOR DARK MORNINGS effortlessly invoke a colorful 1970s world. From the beautiful LA coastline to the grit of Vietnam and the Hospital Compound, each feel unique and richly detailed. And with Shad from motorcycle to visiting the homeless vets, to active combat in Vietnam, there's a compelling pace to the entire opening sequence.

Shad feels like a compelling entry point to the story. In comparing this piece to the countless Vietnam and Vietnam-adjacent shows/films/stories, him being a Psych Officer feels like a small difference but an important one as a fresh POV into the world.

Overall, CAPTAIN is well-crafted and engaging.

FEEDBACK AND VIABILITY

Sofia Rovaletti - Pitch Feedback: The structure of this pitch is excellent! The delivery of the information was perfectly clear, and you have a lot of meaningful material to showcase. This is a very valuable project, not only because is based on a book but also because it has a very important message and concept to deliver, which is the story of how PTSD got discovered. I really do not have anything else to suggest here. I would love to please read the script of the feature and the pilot for the limited series.

Script Feedback: ...the story is very shocking, thrilling and at the same time I feel this is a very important story to tell. The writing, characterization, and dynamic between characters are fantastic.

Literary Department, 1399: Pitch Feedback: This is a very moving and interesting idea for a story. This doc is very effective at conveying a ton of information about the project and is extremely visually engaging as well, which is great. It's also very easy to get a read on tone from the doc which is very helpful too. I do think tonally that this idea stays a bit close to Spike Lee's DA 5 BLOODS, which also deals with the aftermath of Vietnam and the effects of PTSD on American soldiers. I honestly don't really have many critiques—I think you've done a fantastic job here creating an informative, exciting, and visual pitch doc.

Nigel Wooll, Producer (Tar): Just finished your terrific script. It was so enthralling that I read it straight through. This is a must script to be made. Thailand would work perfectly for 90% of the production with an added bonus of 30% tax break.

Jim Young - Pitch Feedback: Really impressive pitch! Appreciate you sending it along. Thought the visuals were strong and help bring the story to life, great job putting such an impressive team together, and no doubt the subject matter is important, inspiring and has a place in the market. Also, good to see a female perspective in terms of the script. Not many notes in terms of the script or the accompanying material which we also checked out. Was great to see the prototypes of actors that could potentially play the roles and given the period nature of the piece and the action sequences, sounds like the right budget range. Regrouped on our end and the challenge with our partners who would be apt to this kind of material and in this budget, range is that our marching orders have been to attach directors that have previous film notoriety even if the person is entirely capable as it appears that you are. It's clear that you have a lot of support and could attract a solid caliber of cast but that's something that has ultimately been a prerequisite unless there's an actor with high enough value to compensate for that. Between all the support there is for the project, how buttoned up the presentation is, the incredibly accomplished team and the importance of the subject matter, you'll be able to find a wonderful home for it.

Matthew Ozuna - Pitch Feedback: This is a well-thought-out pitch delivery that examines all the right elements in presenting a screenplay. Everything is there to know about this project is contained in this pitch, which helps gain a better understanding of the vision of the story. Although this project is your typical Vietnam setting-based film, what helps this project stand out as an original piece is how the story is centered around PTSD among soldiers. By being more focused on that aspect will bring this story a more authentic feeling and will bring an audience that relates with this type of behavior. It could also be somewhat therapeutic for people that may be struggling.


